Nestled in the heart of the mighty Waikato, Sanctuary Mountain[®] Maungatautari is the largest pestproof fenced eco-sanctuary in New Zealand, home to some of the nation's most endangered species. My name is Helen and I'm the General Manager here. A bit about us!

Every day the recently translocated kākāpō mingle with kiwi, hihi, kākā, takahē, geckos and Mahoenui giant wētā (to name a few) in our 3400 hectares, safe in the knowledge that we are actively managing pests and maintaining the 47km of fence line.

We are more than just a stunning sanctuary, we are a place that delivers a comprehensive education experience to 4000 students annually, leaving a lasting imprint of what predator free New Zealand will feel like and sound like. We are also a place that is central to the largest kiwi translocation programme in New Zealand's history. In 2024 we are aiming to translocate 300 kiwi to other conservation projects in the North Island.

It costs us approximately \$5,000 a day to deliver on our annual work programme and ensure unwanted predators are kept out, and central to this goal is the work of our ranger team.

We are proud of our history and how we join with mana whenua and local landowners to be kaitiaki for our iconic sanctuary, delivering a legacy for future generations... and if that's not enough there's even more to come!

A day in the life of a ranger

On any given day the team are hiking the mountain, checking monitoring lines to see if there have been any predator incursions. They are repairing the fence and clearing vegetation to ensure kākāpō stay put.

And then there's the fun of monitoring the fence 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Research informs us that we have less than 90 minutes to repair damage before significant numbers of external predators get in, and for every breach we have a six-week monitoring programme to ensure that we remain pest free.

It's a physically hard job and it is incredibly rewarding. As diverse as our wildlife is, so too are the backgrounds of our team. From baristas, to librarians, to ecologists and vets, the common thread is our love of the environment and the direction we are heading.
